

Survey: Ready For Co-Op?

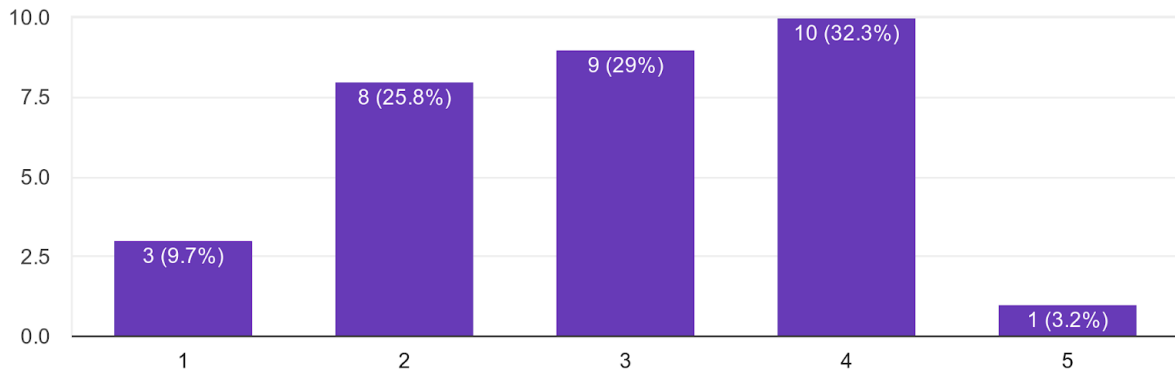

To better understand the impact of various co-op prep activities that we offer the students, I ran a poll of the Software Engineering Class of 2023 about how ready they felt for co-op and about the perceived usefulness of the activities. I polled the students in the middle of the main first interview cycle, and received 32 responses out of a class size of 132. All responses go from 1 = "not useful" to 5 = "very useful".

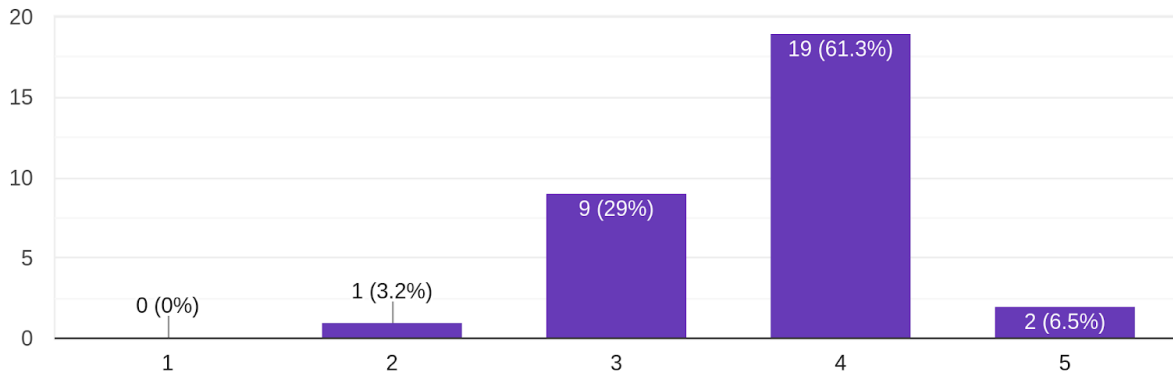
How prepared did you feel for getting a co-op job at the start of 1B?

How prepared do you feel now?

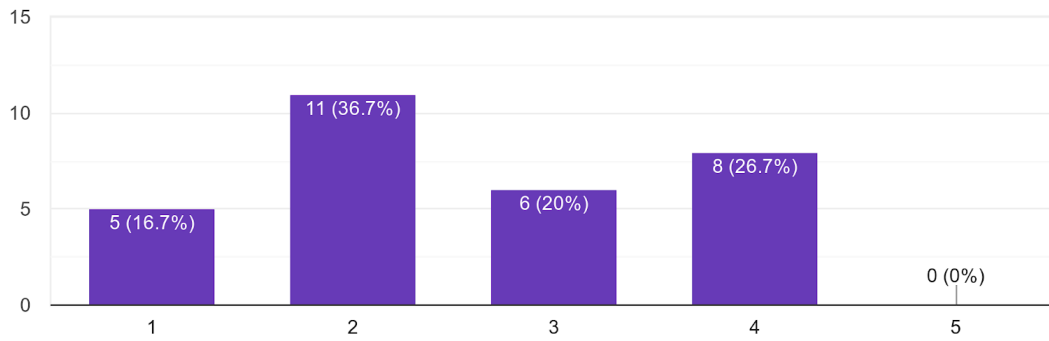

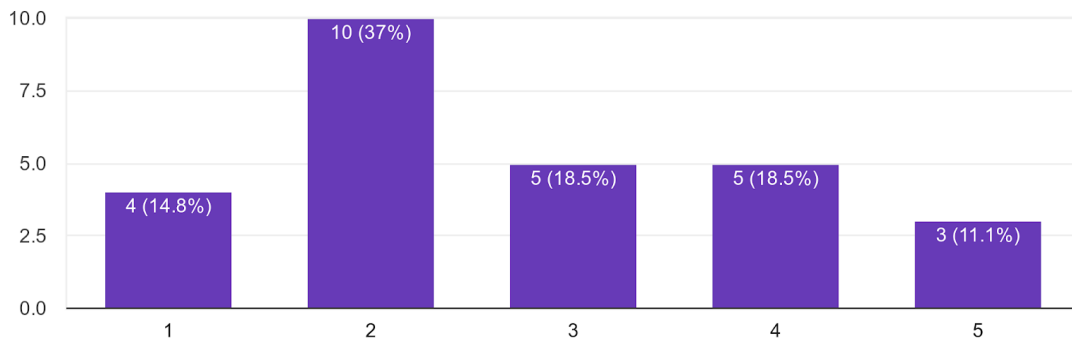
Co-op Fundamentals in SE 101 (1A)

Co-op Fundamentals session in 1B

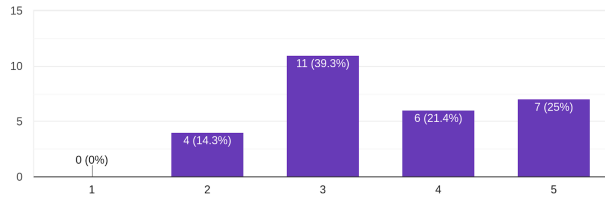

The SE Society organizes, in cooperation with the SE program administration, a number of events for first-year students, including Q&A periods and student panels.

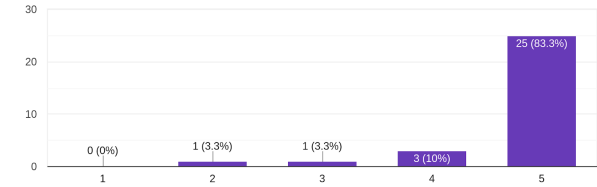
"What I wish I knew in 1B"

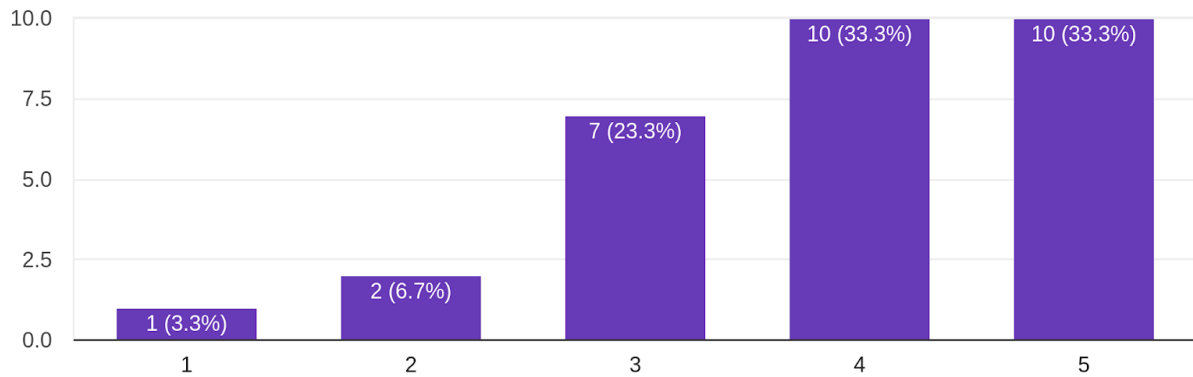
SE Society resumé critiques

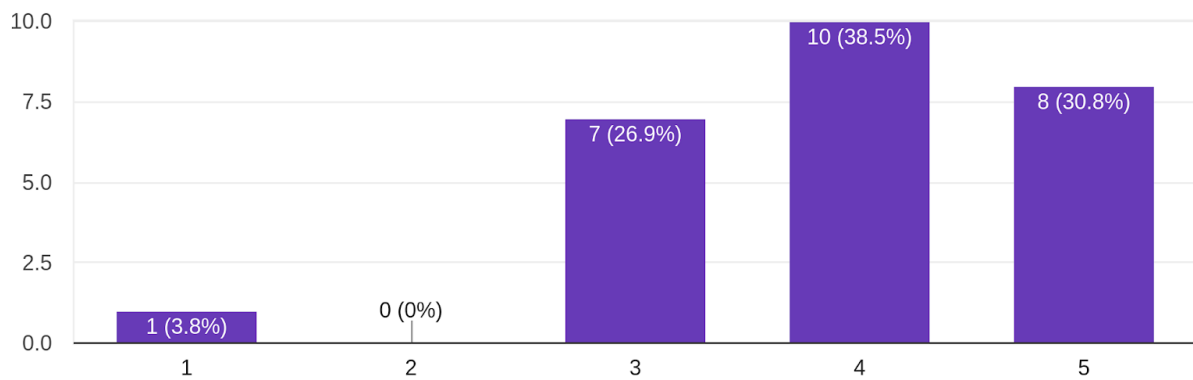

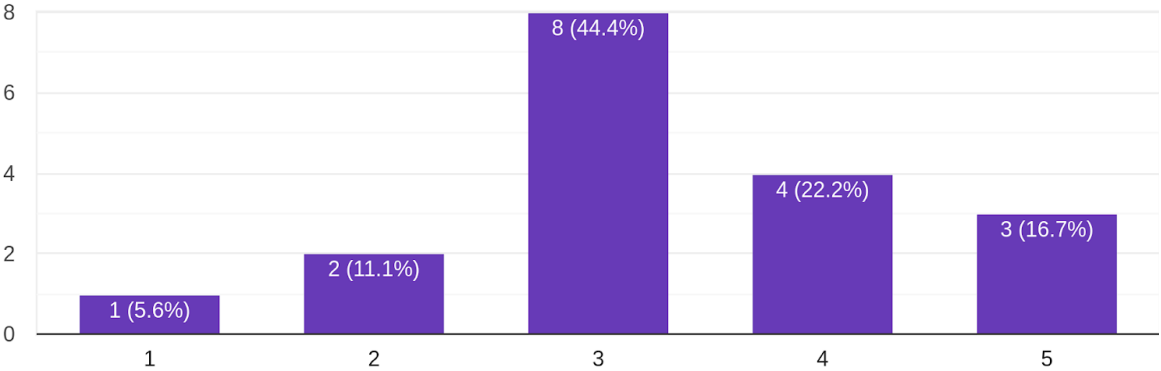

Other groups on campus, as well as CECA, also provide mock interview sessions and résumé critiques. I also asked students about the usefulness of these sessions.

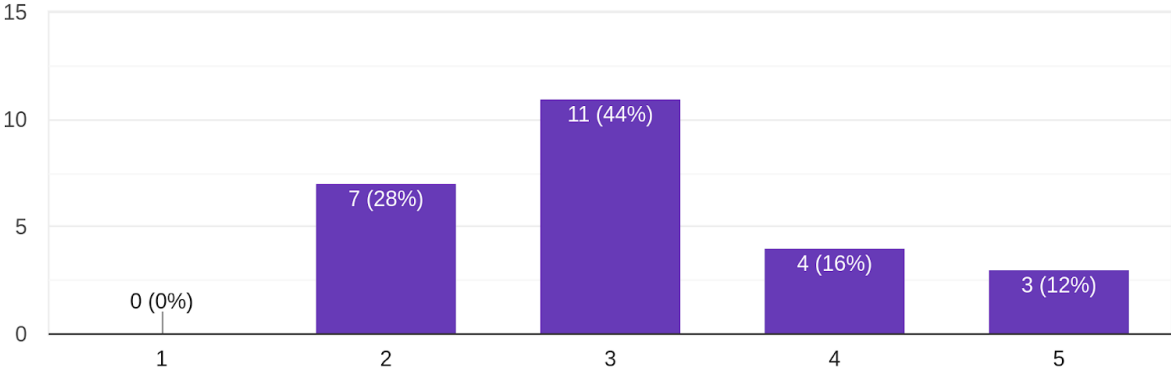
MathSoc mock interview sessions

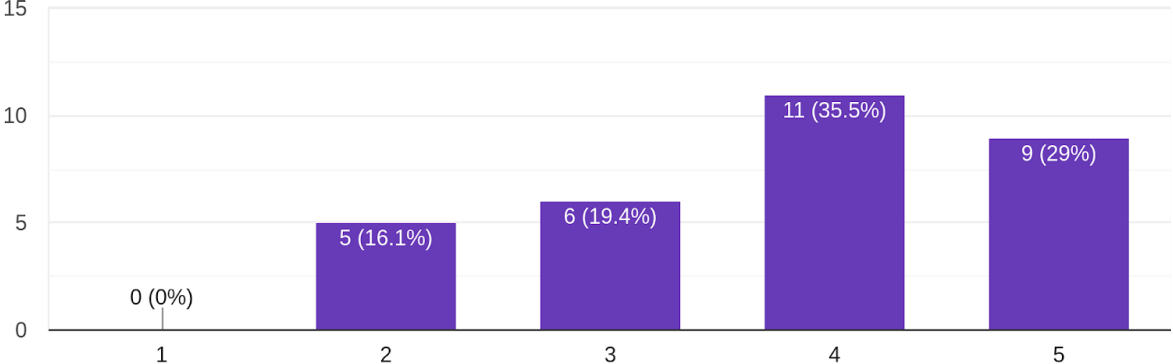


Student Perceptions & Background

The next questions ask about class cohesion and background.

How supportive do you find your classmates in the co-op job search?

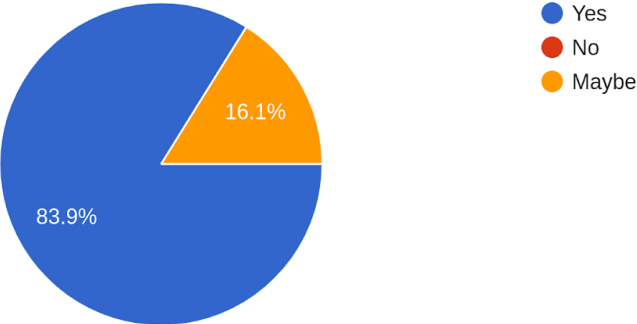

I also ask about student expectations about co-op jobs. As of April 3, 79% of first-year software students have a co-op job. The number after main match was 62%. If recent trends continue, I expect the number of employed students to be almost 100% at the cut-off date.

Do you think you will get a co-op job?

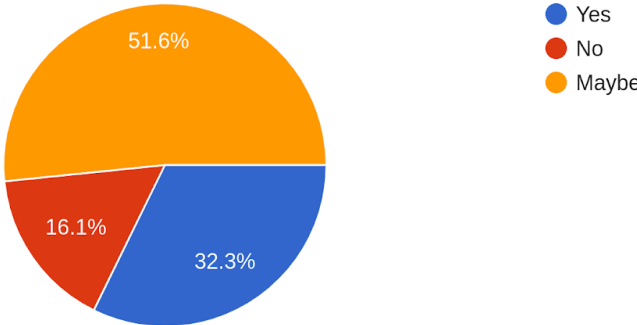

Do you think you will get a good co-op job?

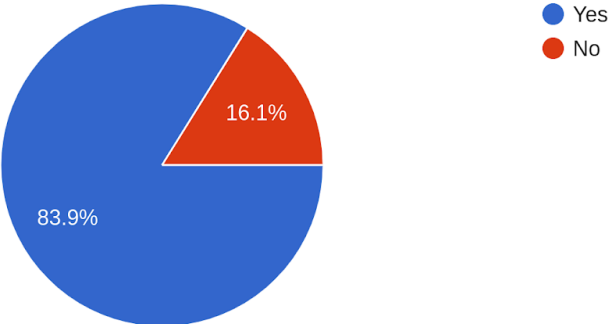

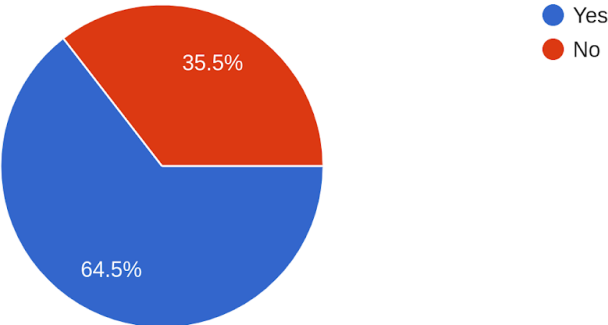
Did you have work experience before coming to the University of Waterloo?

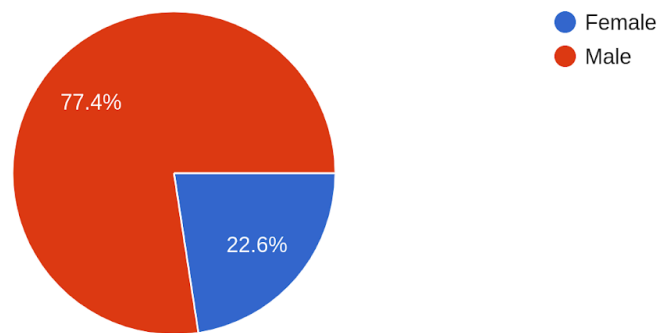


Demographics
